

CONSTRUCTION DESIGN AND MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS 1974

Our policy is to ensure that all operations carried out by our company meet the requirements of the Construction (Design and Management) regulations 1994, The health & Safety at Work Act 1974, and our own Health & Safety policy, regulations and safe working practices.

The implementation of the policy is dependant upon this companies particular role within the project. The details below show duties and responsibilities.

(A) MAIN PRINCIPAL CONTRACTOR (duties and responsibilities).

- i) To assist clients, planners and designers (as far as reasonable practicable in the co-ordination and collation of information relevant to the project in respect of Health & Safety).
- ii) To develop and implement the Health & Safety plan, including obtaining risk assessments from contractors and developing details of how high risk operations can be carried out with minimal risk. Forwarding all relevant information to the relevant planning supervisors for inclusion in the project Health & Safety file.
- iii) Ensure sub-contracted elements of work are carried out only by competent and properly resources contractors. To liase with sub-contractors to ensure their co-operation and co-ordination, and to forward any information to them relating to on-site risks.
- iv) To ensure that all operatives have been given adequate training and that they are properly informed and consulted.
- v) To make sure only authorised people are allowed onto the site, or where working in close proximity to the general public, adequate provision for their protection has been taken.
- vi) To ensure that all safety rules laid down in the Health & Safety plan are strictly complied with by sub-contractors and operatives.
